NEW BOOKS ON LOCAL HISTORY

AMATEUR HISTORIAN. Current issue (Vol.7. No.2.1966) includes: Peter Eden - Studying your parish church.

E.J.Priestley - Illustrating local history; lists nineteen sources of reference to items illustrative of local history.

BAGLEY, J.J. The English poor law. Macmillan. 1966. 6/-. 64p. A pleasant little introductory booklet to the subject. Well presented and illustrated.

BAGLEY, J.J. Historical interpretation; sources of English mediaeval history, 1066-1540. Pelican (Penguin), 1965. 6/-. An interesting selection from the outstanding source material for each century.

CONGREGATIONAL HISTORICAL SOCIETY. Current issue (Vol.XX.No.3.May,1966) Includes a helpful note on Early Separatist burial practice. It is valuable to learn from this short article that 'Brownist' group meeting near Bedlam were burying without ceremony as late as 1639. Genealogists please note !

COUNCIL FOR BRITISH ARCHAEOLOGY. Archaeological bibliography for Great Britain and Ireland, 1964. Published by the Council. 1966. 20/-. Expensive at first sight (89 p. and paper covers), but packed with references to every aspect of archaeology; 620 books indexed, by author and subject and arranged by county, then period.

EMMISON, F.G. Archives and local history. Methuen. 1966. 30/-. 112p. Author is County Archivist of Essex and he has written a delightful book, particularly helpful to amateur historians.

- ESSEX RECORD OFFICE. Catalogue of Essex parish records: 1240-1894, compiled by F.G.Emmison. New edition. 1966. 40/-. 276p. Historical introduction, followed by catalogue of the records of the 410, pre-1894, Essex parishes; in alphabetical order, with a detailed index to subjects and places and an appendix on Charity and parochial schools. Invaluable as an indication of what has survived in this county, and worth the money for the introduction and facsimiles alone.
- FLETCHER, Geoffrey. London overlooked. Hutchinson, 1964. 30/-. 128p. "The London overlooked by the glossy guidebooks. Hampstead and Hoxton; shopfronts and cemeteries".
- FLETCHER, Geoffrey. Pearly Kingdom. Hutchinson, 1965. 30/-. 101p. Pleasant vignettes of the East End and South London.
- GREATER LONDON RECORD OFFICE. Guide to the Middlesex Sessions Records, 1549-1889. G.L.C. 1965. 10/-. 98p. Useful historical introduction to the Records (at the former Middlesex Record Office) of the Quarter Sessions, followed by lists of records available for consultation within each category.
